

- » Engaged dialogue for shared meaning making and action taking



Strategic Adaptive Action

- » What?
 - » Surprises are we seeing?
 - » Is stable, unstable, emergent?
 - » Are different perspectives?
 - » Is same as/different from before?
 - » Are objective, subjective, normative truths?
 - » Patterns are emerging, passing away?
 - » Are the results of our previous Adaptive Actions?




Strategic Adaptive Action

- » So what?
 - » Patterns are most fit to purpose?
 - » Is known, knowable, unknowable?
 - » Are alternative explanations?
 - » Do we expect from other players?
 - » Resources are available to us?
 - » Are our constraints and degrees of freedom?
 - » Questions are emerging?
 - » Are our options for action?



Strategic Adaptive Action

- » Now what?
 - » Option for action is most highly leveraged?
 - » Might we anticipate in response to our action?



- » Plans can we make to implement?
- » Time horizon is fit to this Adaptive Action cycle?
- » Data should we be prepared to collect?
- » Should we document to support future learning?
- » Should we communicate to others?
