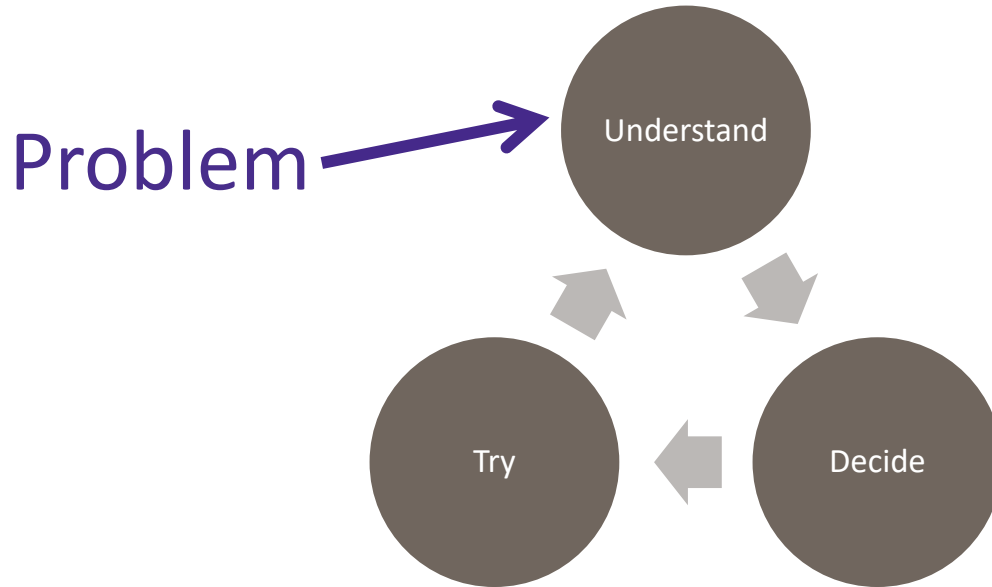


# Collaborating to Use the Landscape Diagram





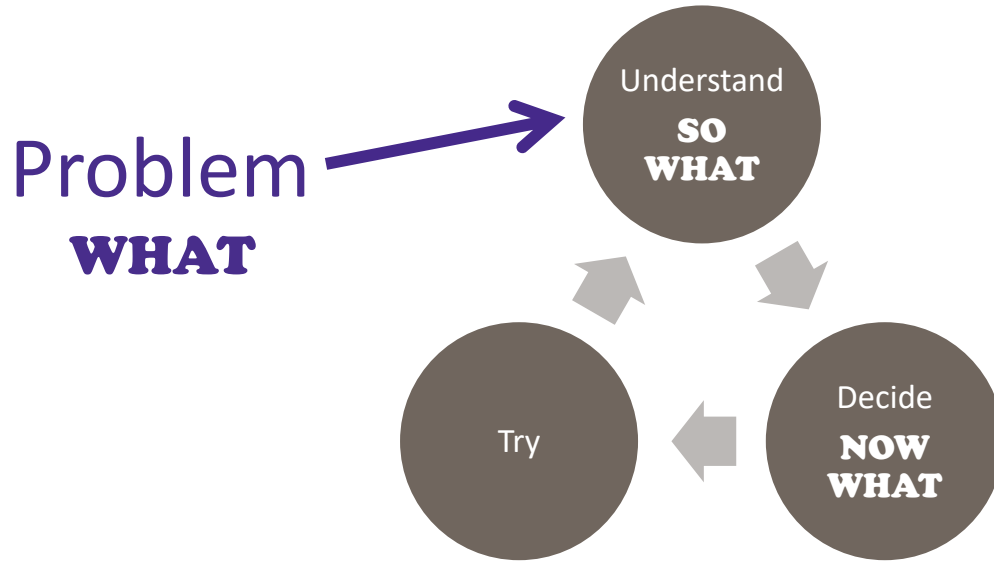
# Problem-Solving Cycle

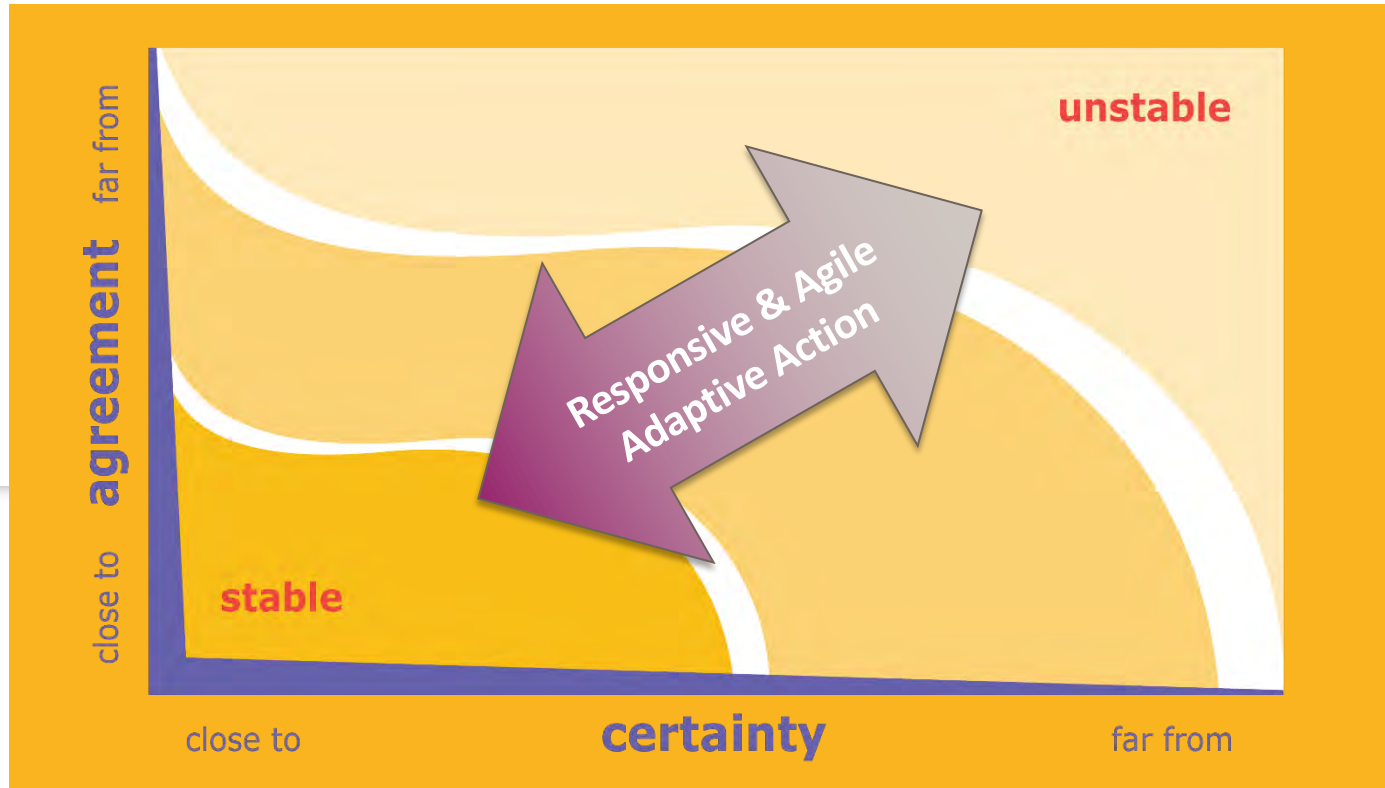


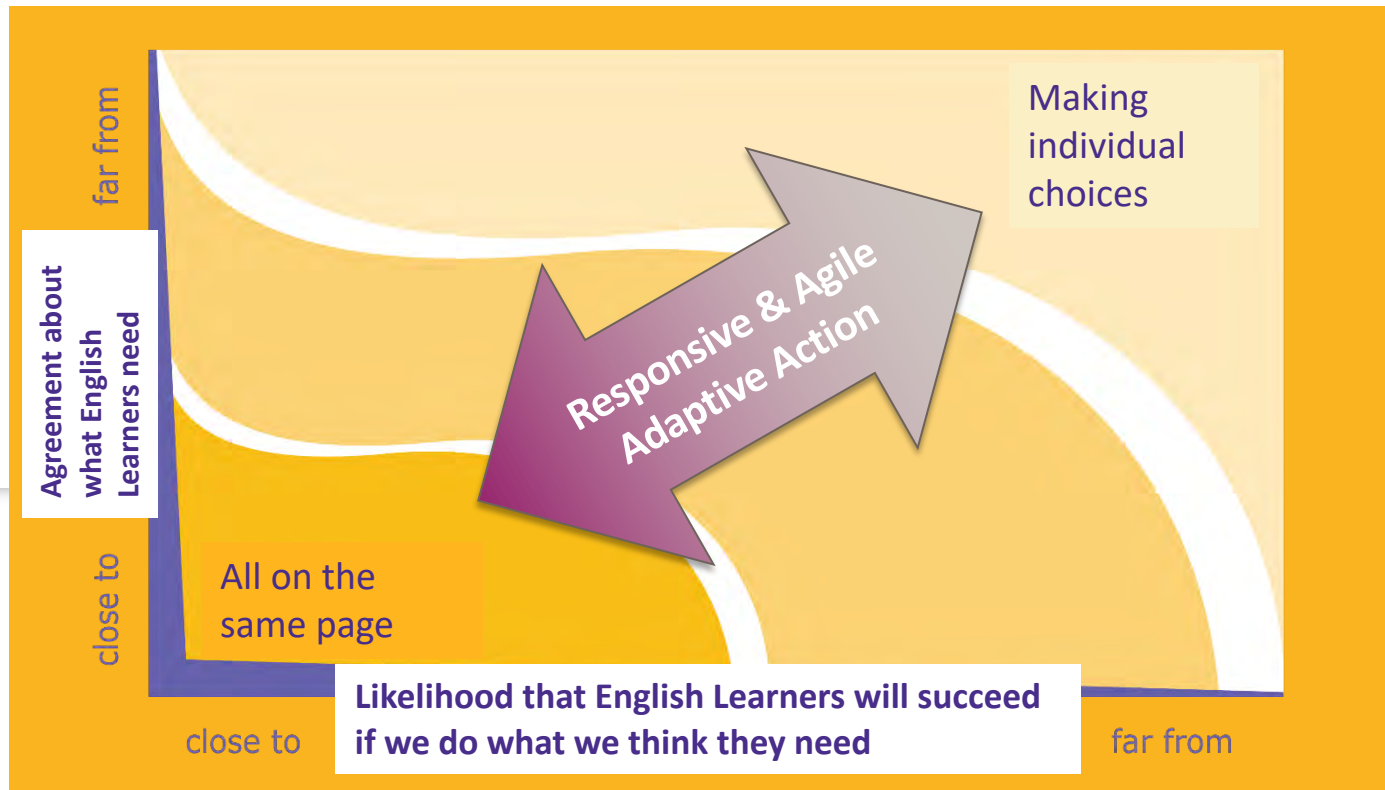

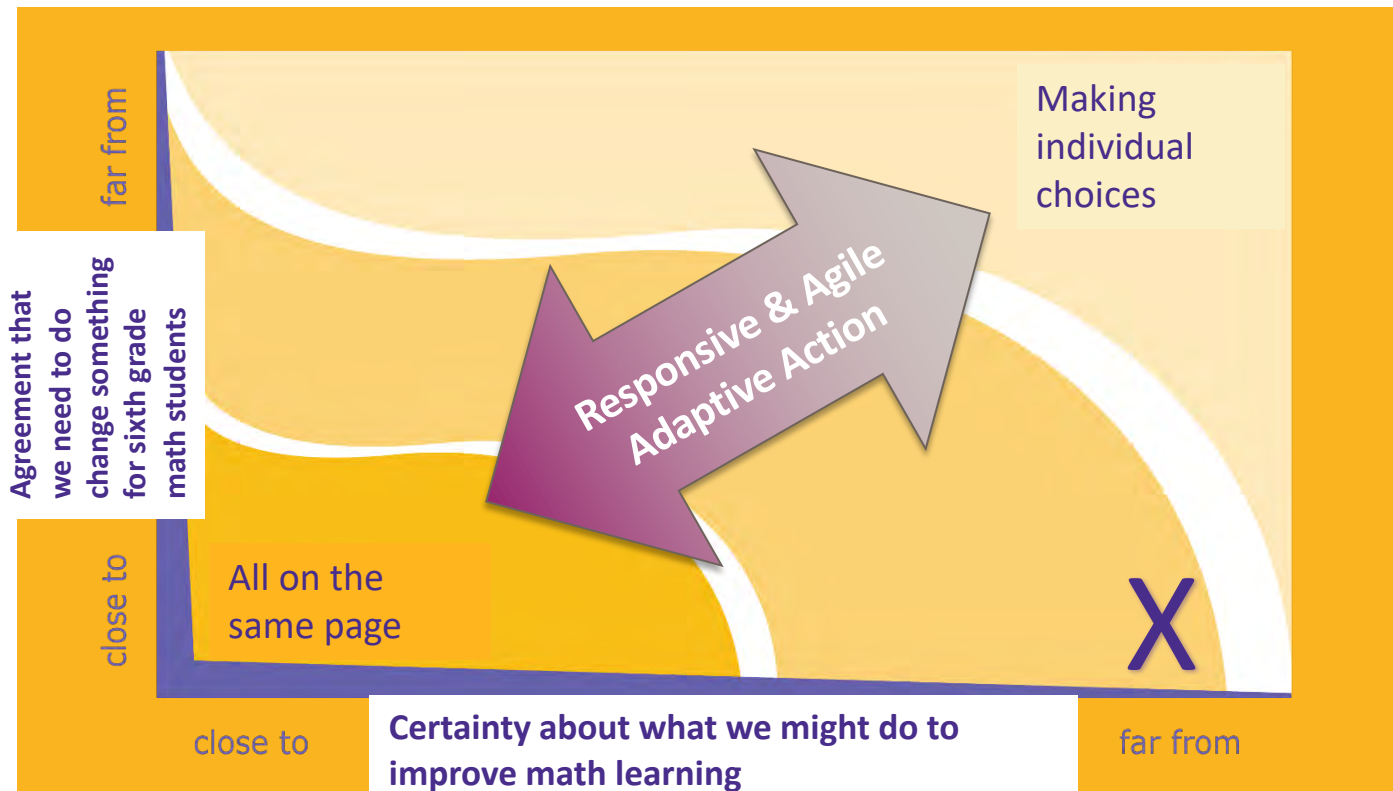

# Connect through stories and impacts

- ▶ Narrative Analysis Tool: [Spryng.io](https://spryng.io)
- ▶ You tell a story in response to a prompt
- ▶ As the storyteller, you tag from your own perspective
- ▶ Tags for multiple stories are visualized to reveal patterns
- ▶ Inspired by ground-breaking work of Cynthia Kurkz and Dave Snowden



# When did HSD make a difference?

We are always excited to hear stories about how members of the HSD Community of Praxis make a difference in the world. Our HSD 2051 exploration invited us to turn that delight into a strategy and a new Simple Rule:

***Connect with stories and impacts.***

This storytelling/sensemaking survey begins to implement that strategy. Thanks for being involved!

In this survey, we invite you to tell a story and answer some questions. We think it will take you between 10 and 30 minutes, depending on how you choose to tell your story.

If you complete the survey, we understand that you give us permission to use your input. You are welcome to include your name or not. If you share your name in the final question, we understand that you give us permission to quote your story in Institute communications and share your other data with HSD Community of Praxis, Institute staff, and board. Including you! We will share data we gather from this first round by mid-January. During 2020 you will receive invitations to tell more stories like this, or maybe even some different ones.

So, let's get started . . .

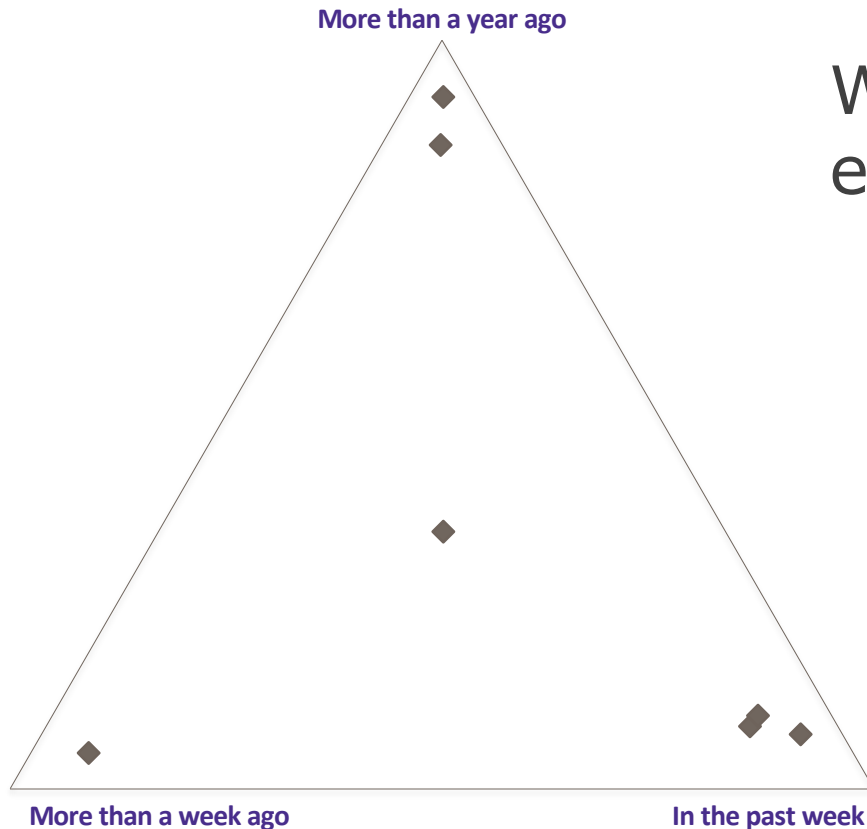

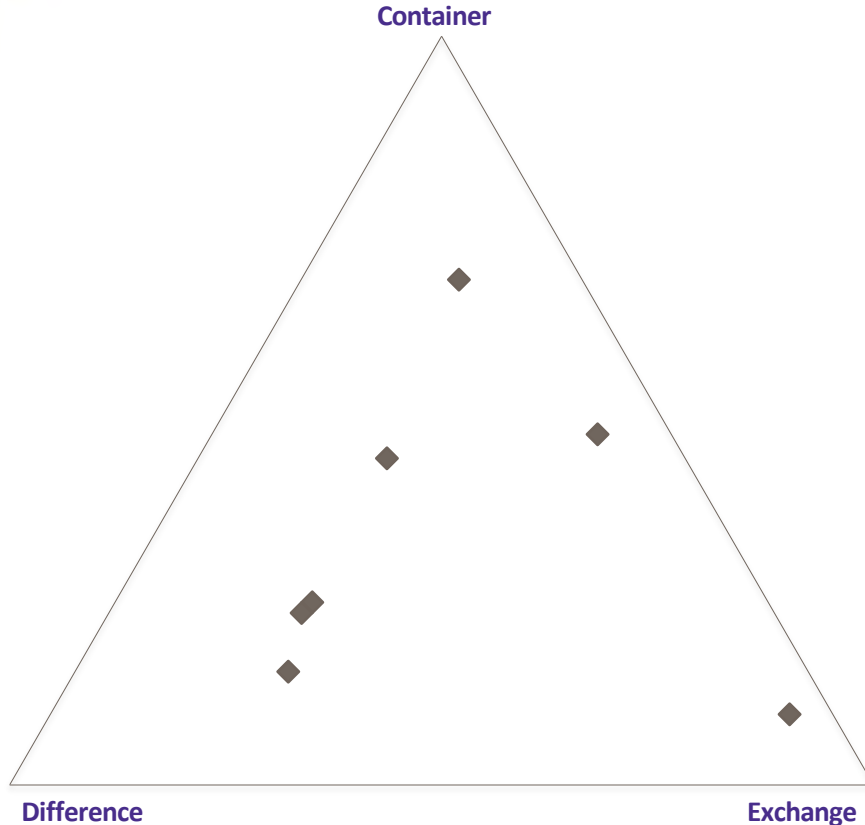


# Sample Story

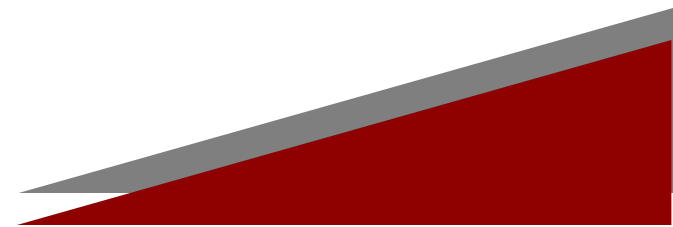

# When did this experience happen?

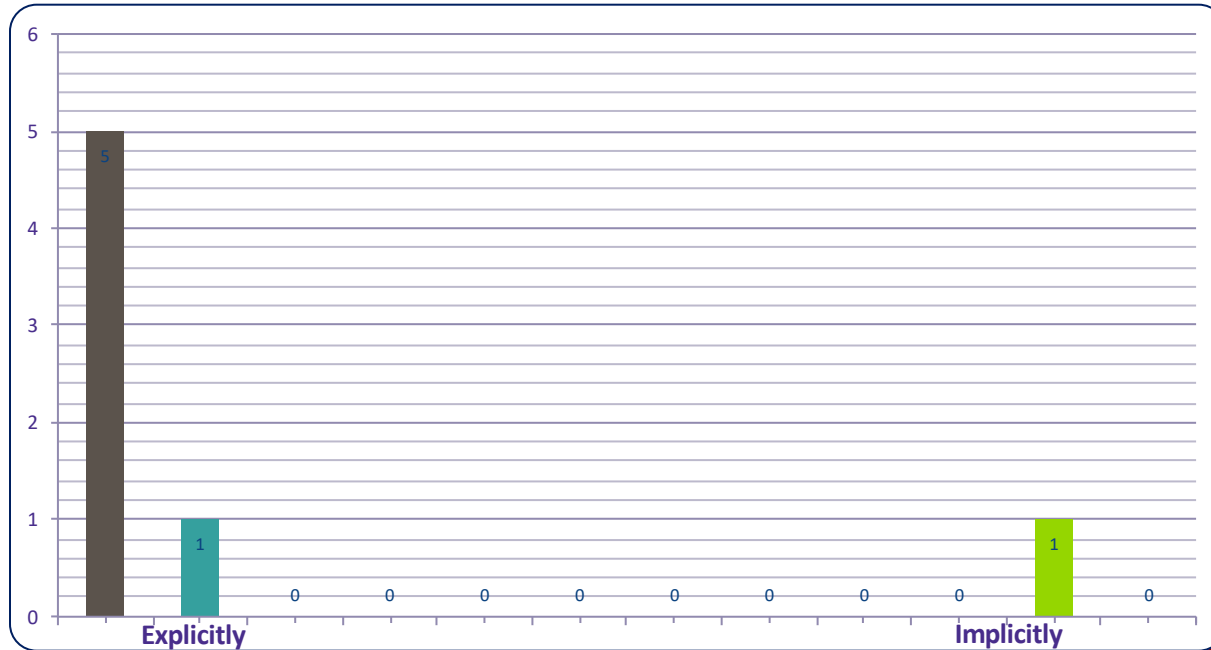


Which conditions for self-organizing did you focus on?



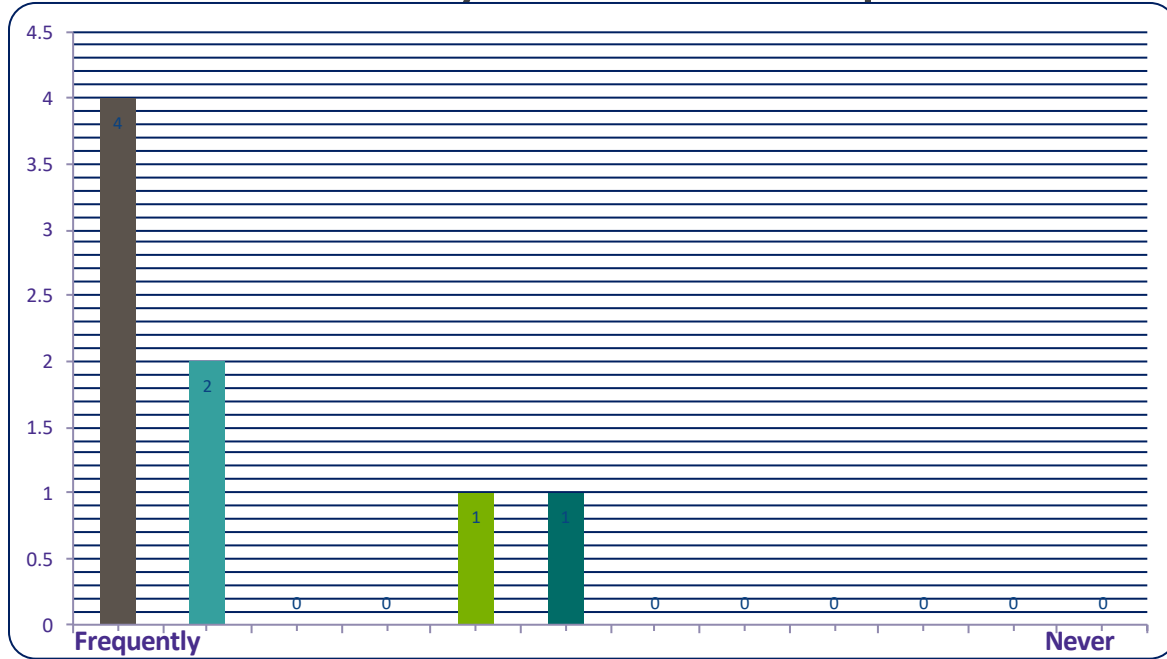


# How did you present HSD in this experience?



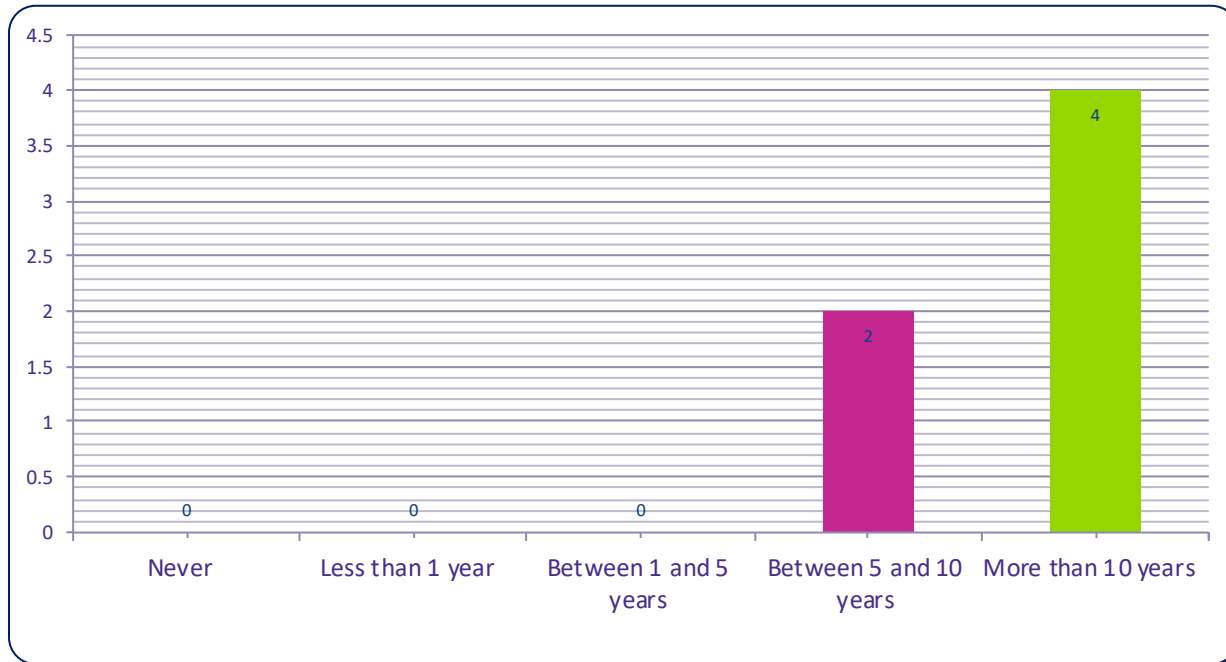


# How often do you have experiences like this?
